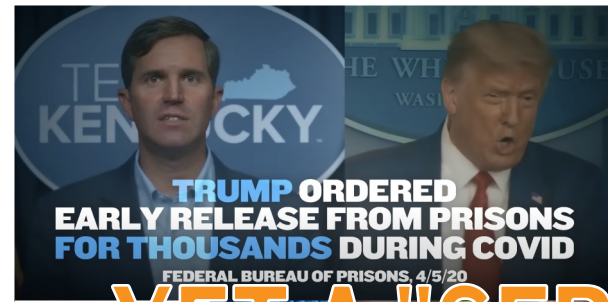

LESSONS FROM THE RESEARCH-OWNING SAFETY, ACCOUNTABILITY, AND JUSTICE

1. SAFETY

Real solutions that work to prevent crime, respond to crisis, and stop violence.

2. ACCOUNTABILITY

Personal responsibility is about repair and changing behavior, not just punishment.

3. JUSTICE

A system that works for all by relying less on incarceration and more on the things proven to help communities thrive.

Get out in front of the “soft on crime” attack with a strong message about preventing crime, responding to crisis, and stopping violence.

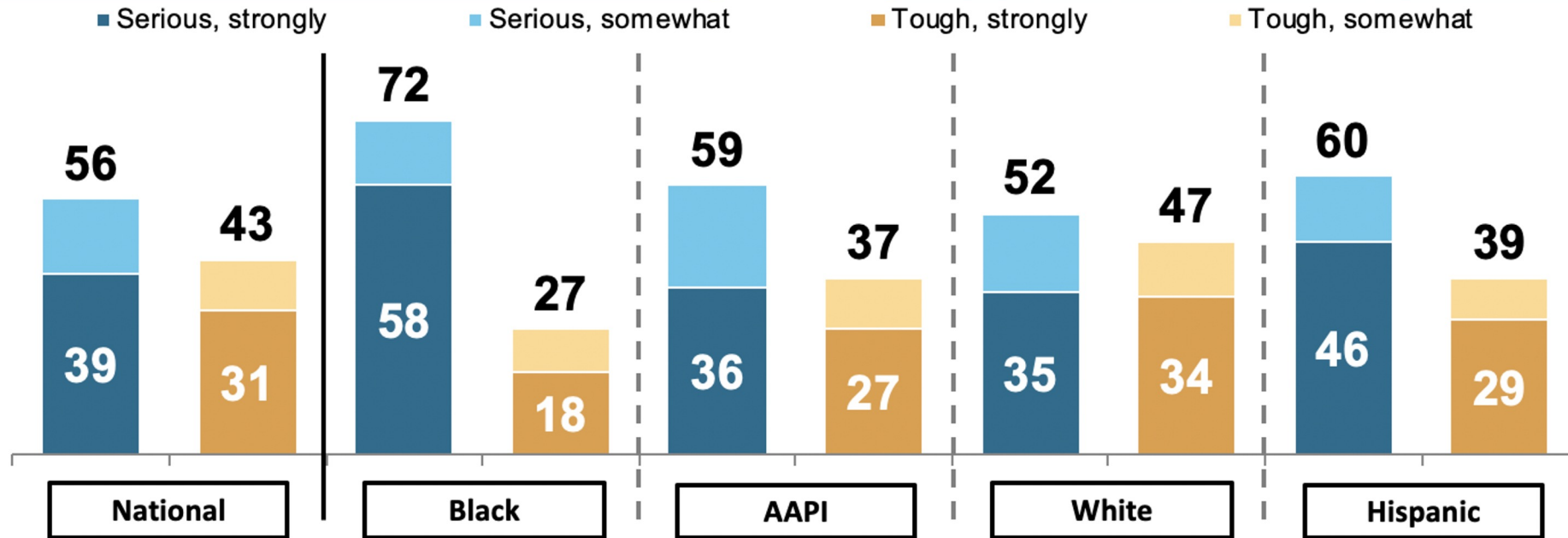

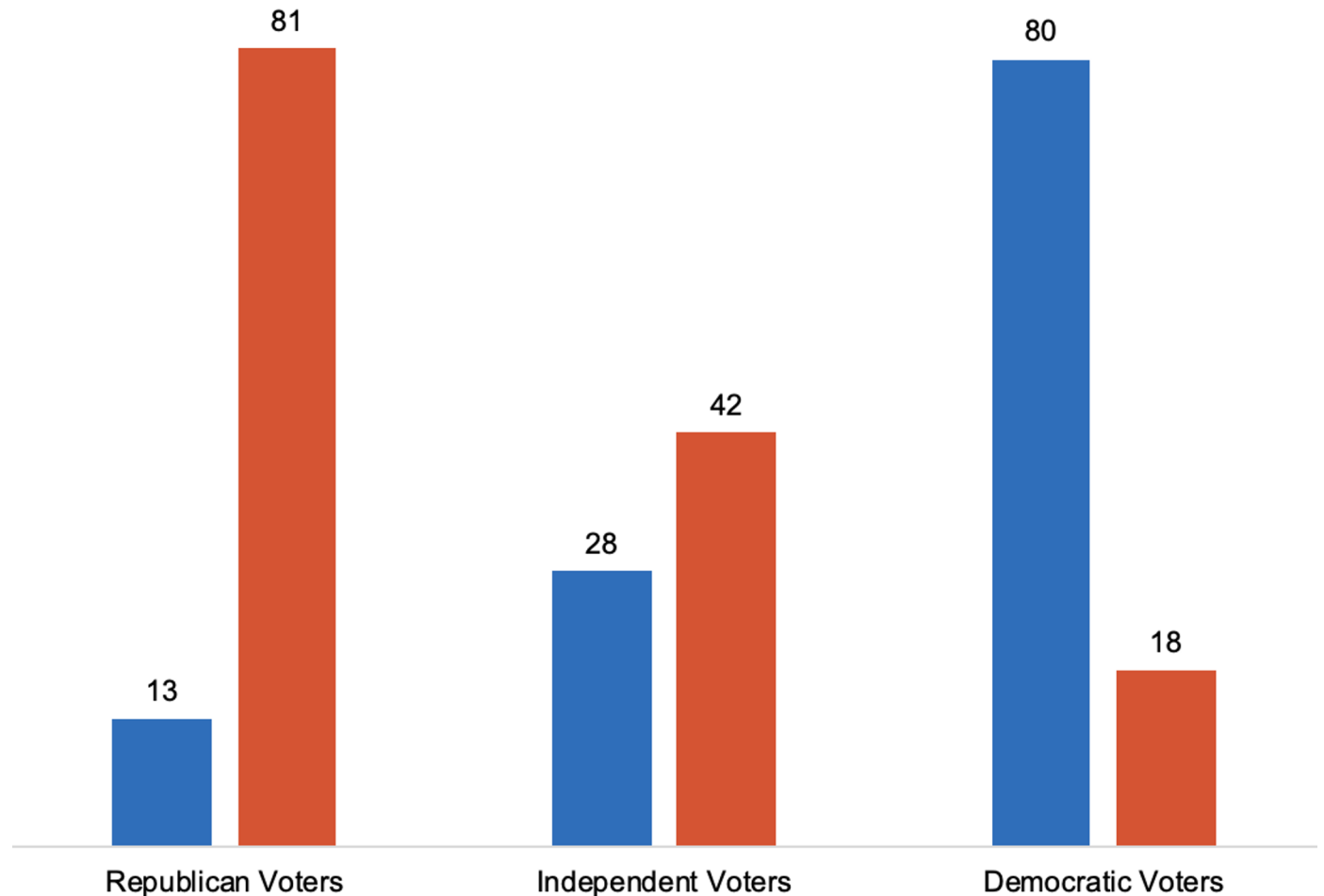

...YET VIRGINIA'S INDEPENDENT VOTERS REJECT "TOUGH ON CRIME" BY 22 PERCENTAGE POINTS

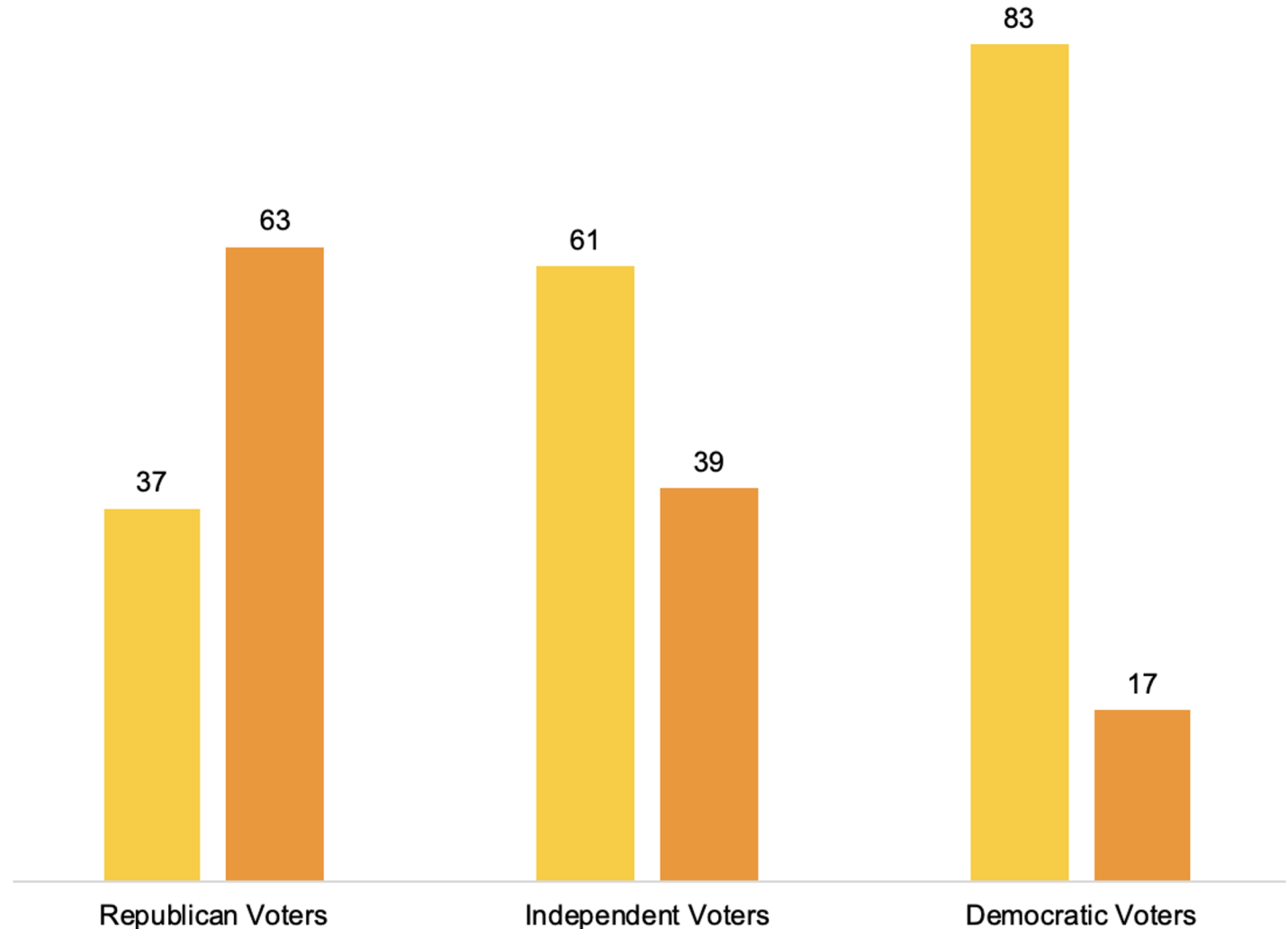

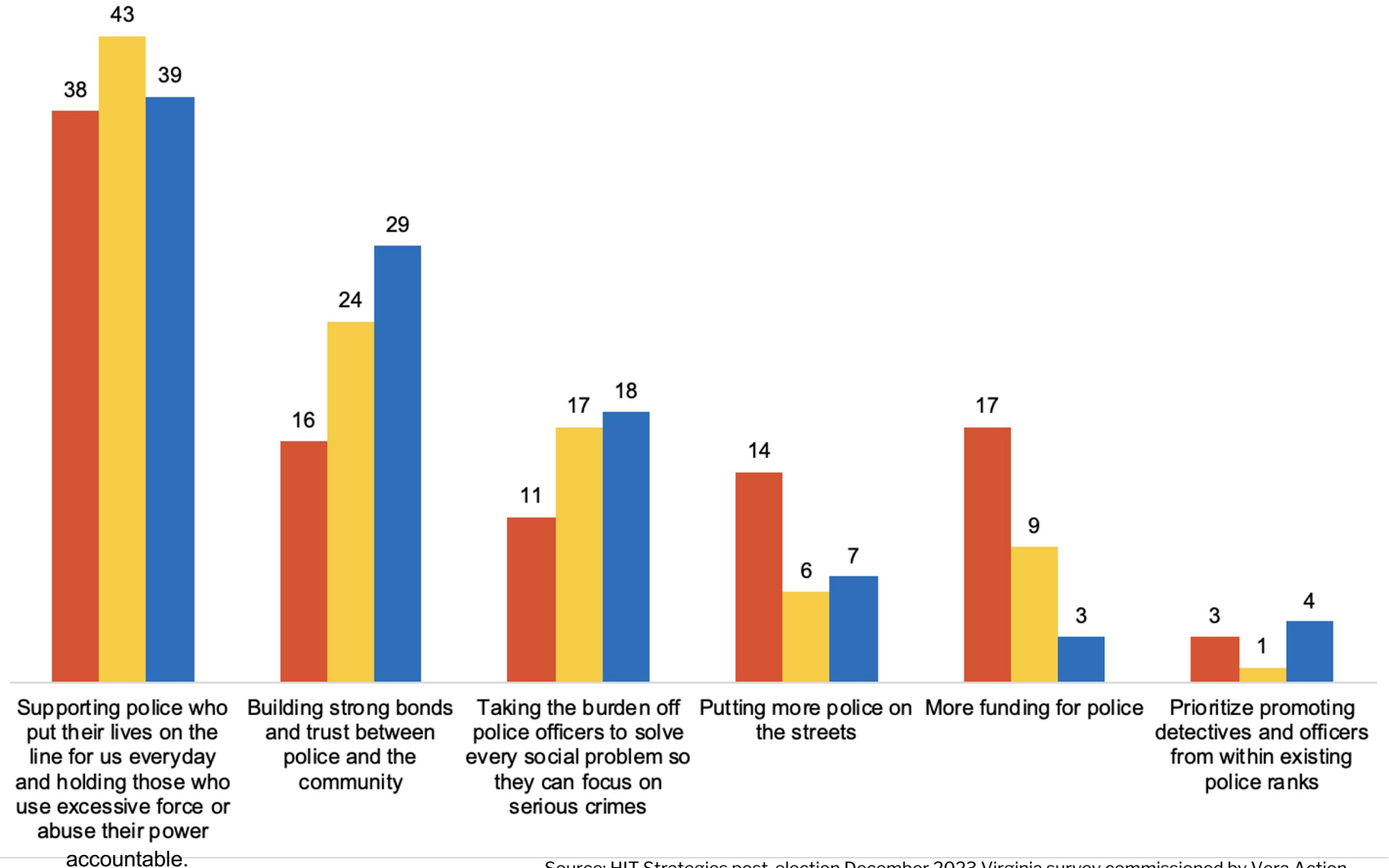

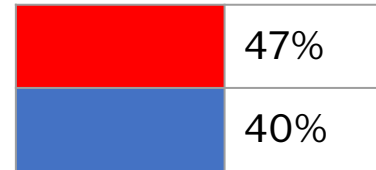
AGAINST THE SAME ATTACK, A “TOUGH” RESPONSE LAGS WHERE A “SERIOUS” ONE WINS OUT

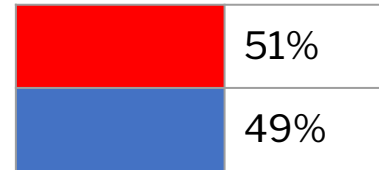
DEM “TOUGH ON CRIME”:

DEM “SERIOUS ABOUT SAFETY, STABILITY, SECURITY”:

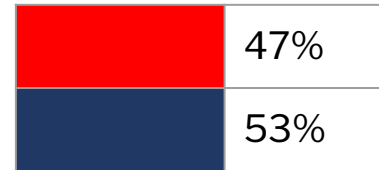

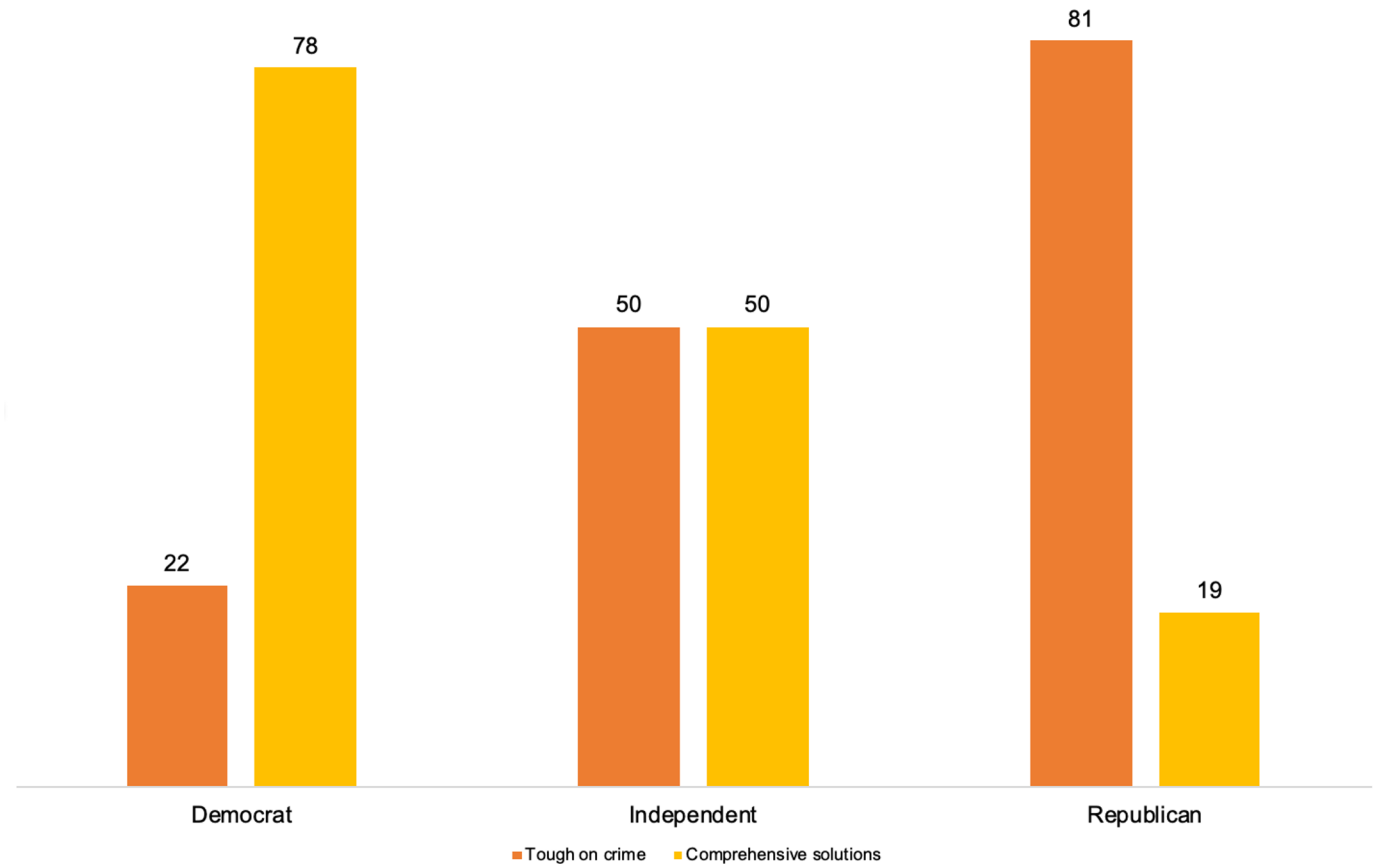

ON FENTANYL, COMPREHENSIVE SOLUTIONS WIN OVER DEMOCRATS AND HOLD GROUND WITH INDEPENDENTS

COMPREHENSIVE SOLUTIONS: We can't look away from how drugs like fentanyl have devastated too many families. While some politicians are trying to exploit this grave issue, we need real solutions, not more rhetoric. A comprehensive strategy is needed to fight this epidemic. That means investing in new technology to detect fentanyl and drugs to stop them from crossing the border and reaching our communities. Here at home, we should fully fund solutions like overdose prevention centers, mobile treatment programs, and fentanyl test strips. This issue is bigger than politics, and we need to be serious about making us all feel safer.

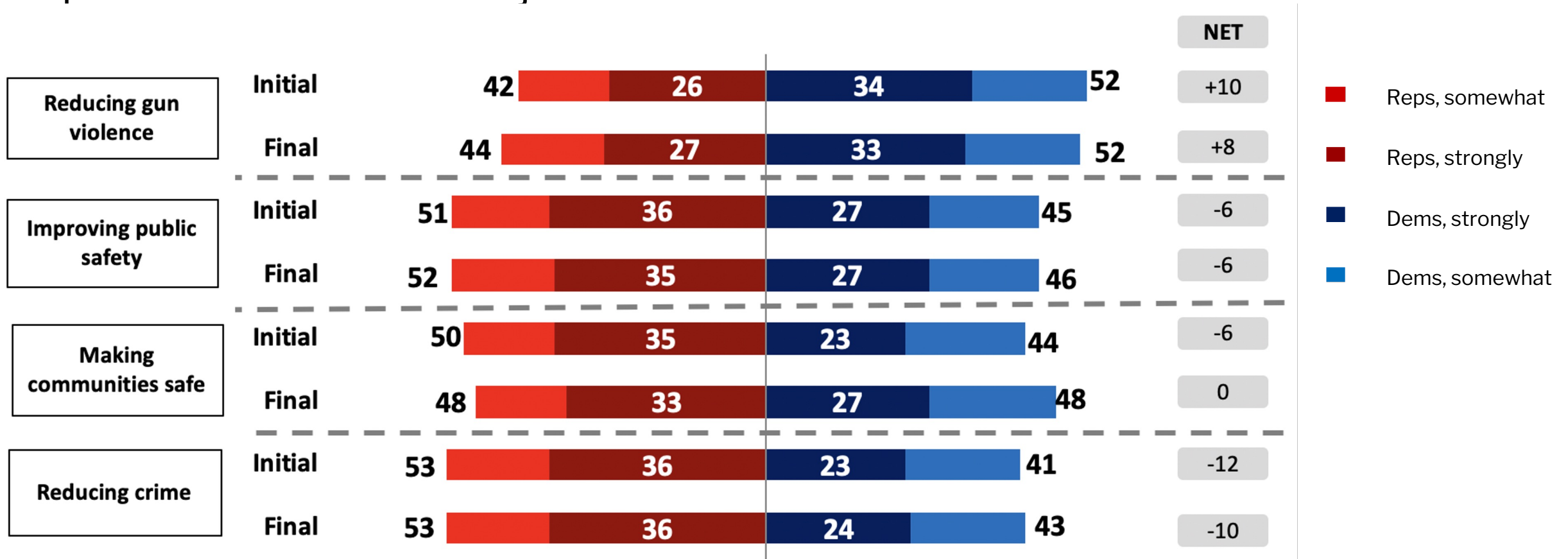

over three State of the Union addresses.

State of the Union 2022

“Let’s not abandon our streets or choose between **safety and equal justice**. Let’s come together and protect our communities, restore trust, and hold law enforcement accountable.

We should all agree the answer is not to defund the police. It’s to fund the police. Fund them. Fund them. Fund them with the resources and training — resources and training they need to protect our communities.”

State of the Union 2023

“We all want the same thing: neighborhoods free of violence, law enforcement who earns the community’s trust.

We know **police officers put their lives on the line** every single night and day. **And we know we ask them, in many cases, to do too much — to be counselors, social workers, psychologists — responding to drug overdoses, mental health crises, and so much more. In one sense, we ask much too much of them.**

But what happened to Tyre in Memphis happens too often. We have to do better. We also need **more first responders and professionals to address the growing mental health, substance abuse challenges.** More resources to reduce violent crime and gun crime. **More community intervention programs. More investments in housing, education, and job training. All this can help prevent violence in the first place.**

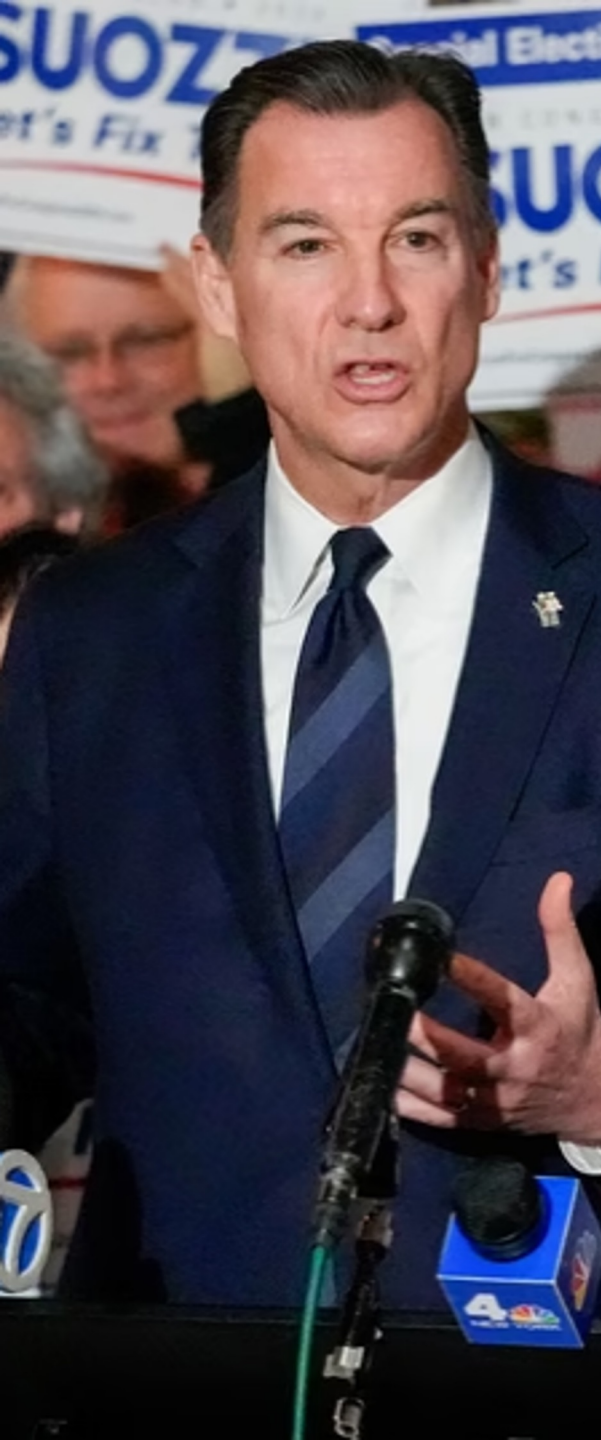
And when police officers or police departments **violate the public trust**, they must be held **accountable.**”

State of the Union 2024

“To state the obvious, all Americans **deserve the freedom to be safe.** And America is safer today than when I took office. The year before I took office, murder rates went up 30 percent.

It was then, through my American Rescue Plan Act, that we made the largest investment in public safety ever.

Last year, the murder rate saw the sharpest decrease in history. Violent crime fell to one of its lowest levels in more than 50 years. But we have more to do. We have to **help cities invest in more community police officers, more mental health workers, more community violence intervention.**”



A FEW MORE NARRATIVE TIPS

1. Lead with the shared values of safety, accountability, and justice.

Acknowledge the importance of safety and that we deserve an honest conversation based in solutions, not scare tactics, about what makes communities safe. Take back and redefine accountability. Everyone can walk through the safety door to get to accountability and justice.

1. “Tough on crime” is the villain that keeps us from real safety.

Across the political spectrum, a majority don't believe 'tough on crime' is working. Name it as the empty scare tactic that it is. If it worked, we would be the safest country in the world.

1. Rely on empathy, not simply data, to persuade.

Countering falsely-held beliefs with empathy is more persuasive than contradicting with data. Arguing about crime statistics, for example, with legislators or the public is often not effective. Setting the record straight with journalists and media is, though.

1. Pivot to solutions.

There is strong support for community-based solutions. Highlight specific programs and how they work, who they serve, and the impact they have. This is where the data is persuasive.
