TAKEAWAY # 1:

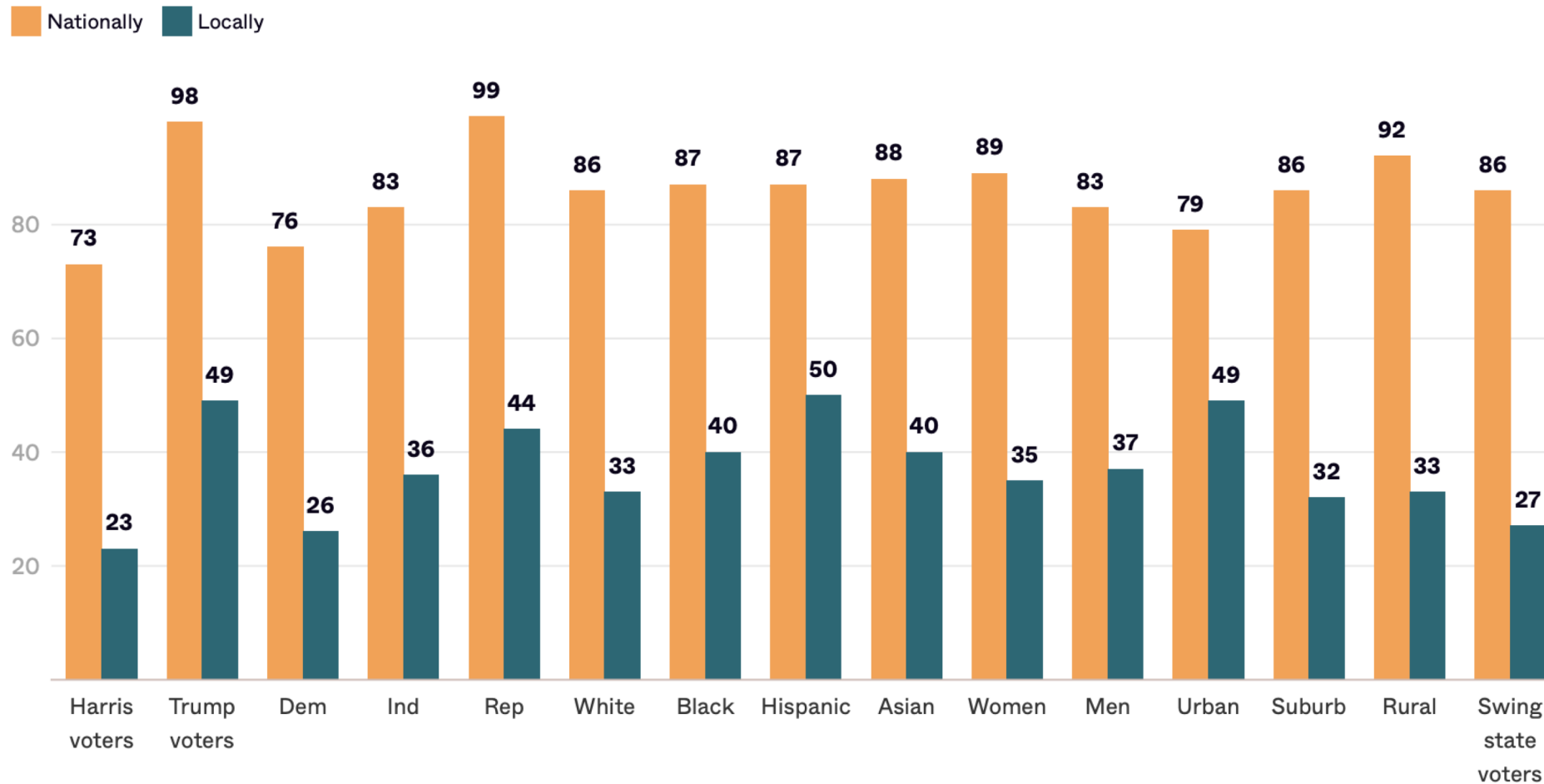


TAKEAWAY # 2:

Even though crime is not a top voting issue, it lurks right under the surface as a critical one for voters. When races are won and lost on the margins, inoculating against this line of attack is critical.

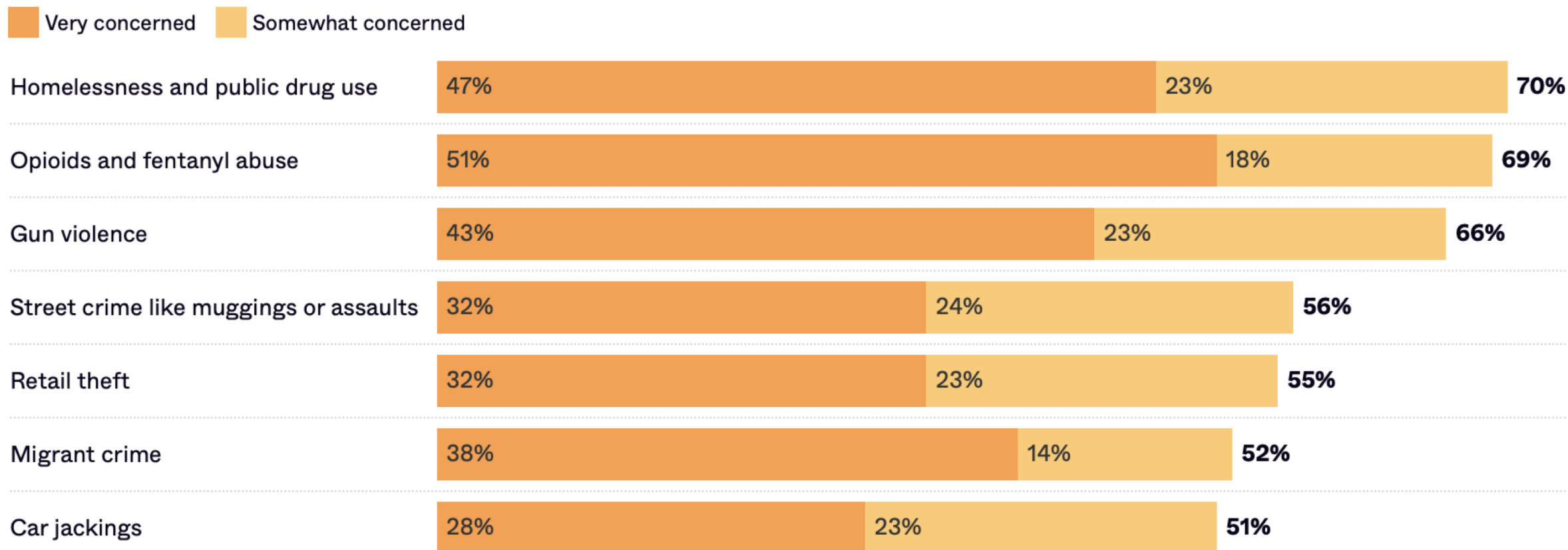

How concerned are you about each of the following types of crime impacting you?

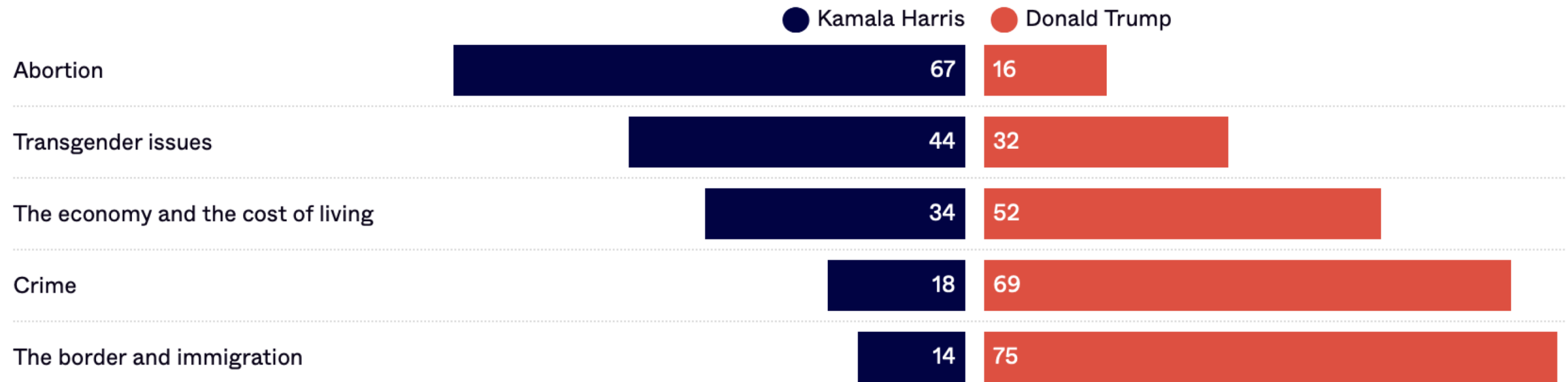


TAKEAWAY # 3:

Trying to “out-tough” the opposition doesn’t work. Democrats need to create a values contrast to the GOP. Despite running a “tough-on-immigration-and crime” campaign, VP Harris’s message failed to break through.

Who did you hear more from on each of the following issues?

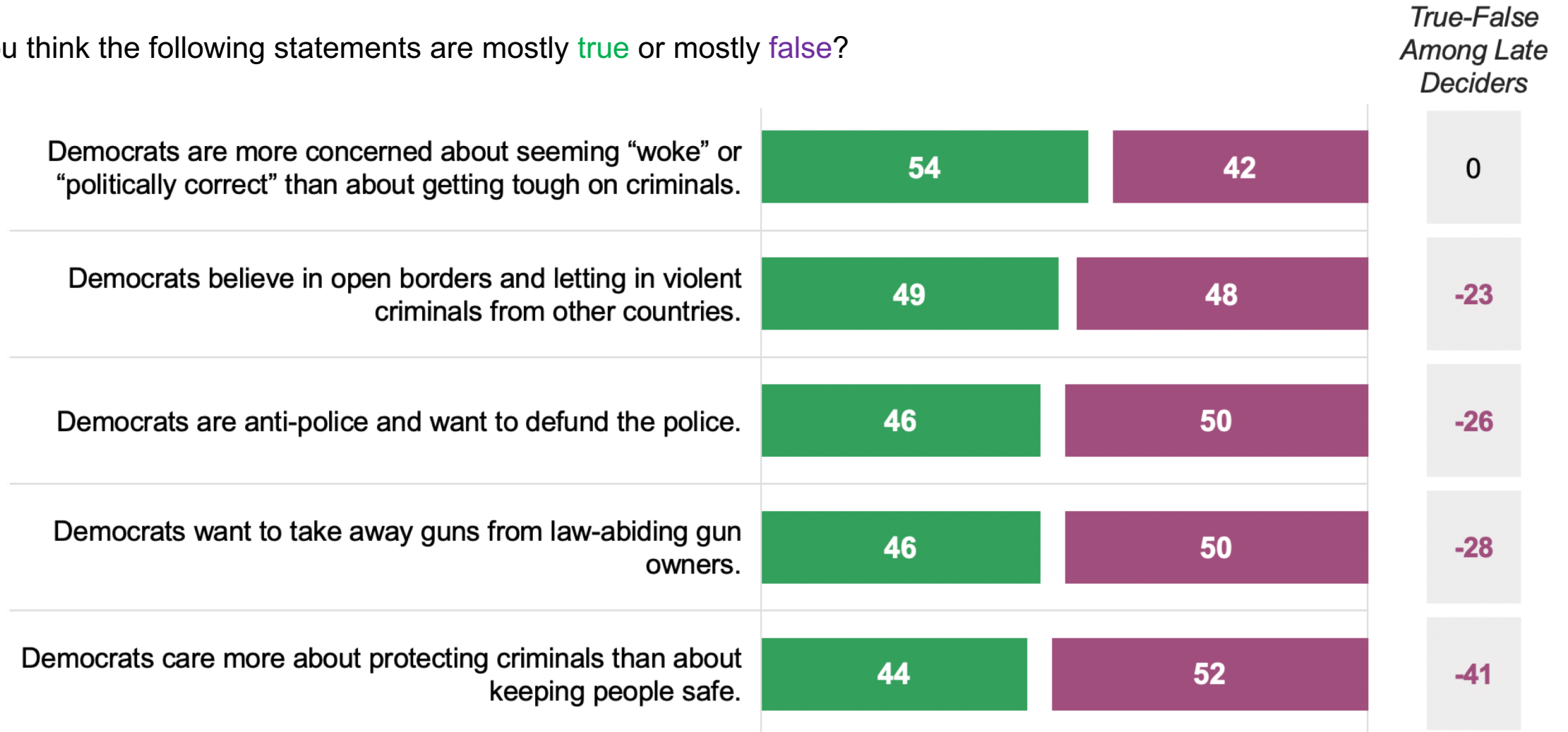


TAKEAWAY # 4:

Do you think the following statements are mostly **true** or mostly **false**?

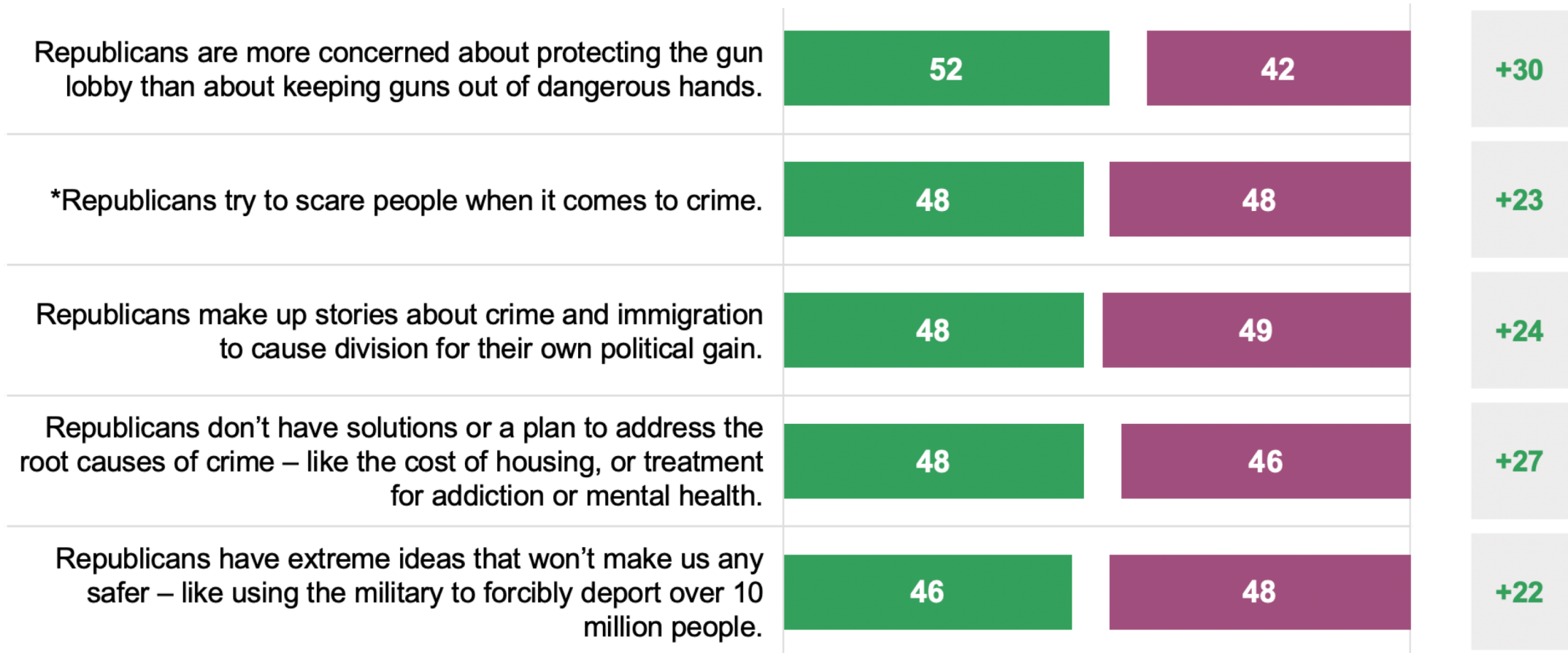

TAKEAWAY # 5:

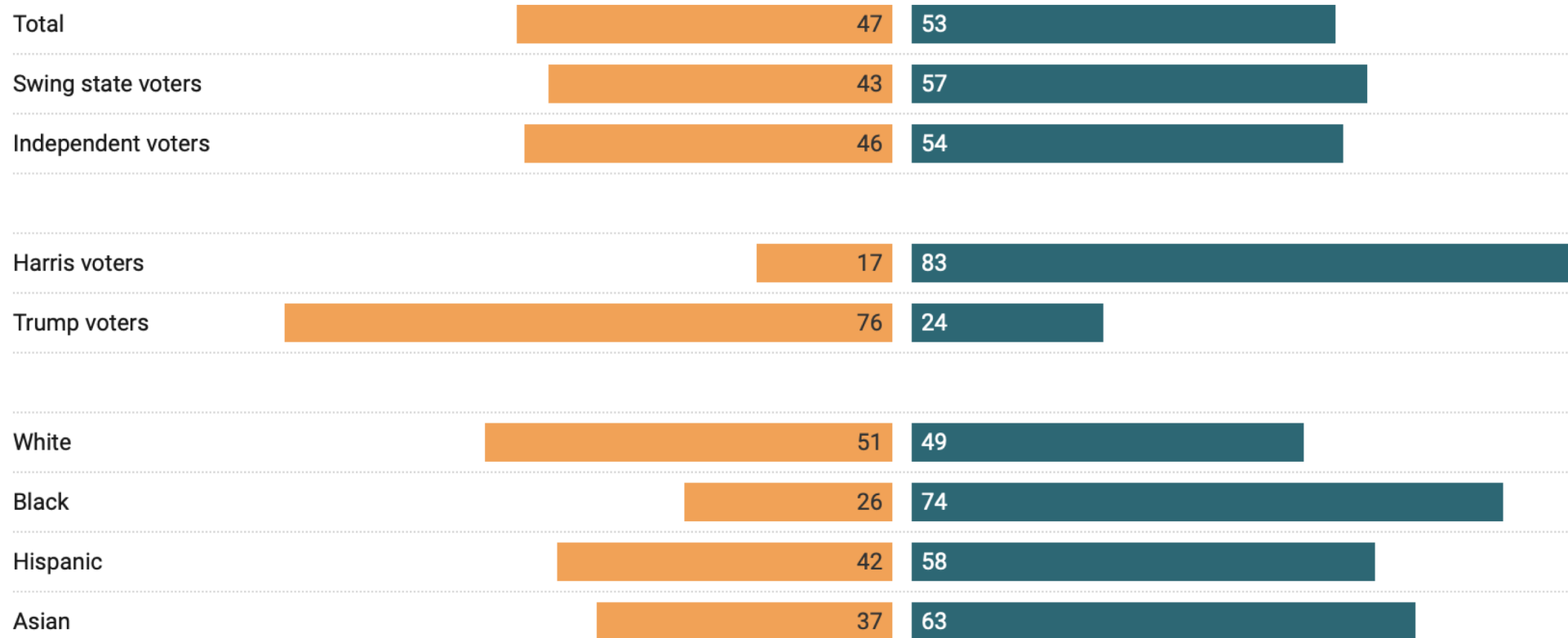
Democrats can counter “tough” attacks by getting off the opposition’s narrative playing field, creating a values contrast, and leading with solutions. Flip the frame to being “serious about safety.”

Do more to get **tough on crime** – like having tougher sentences for people convicted of violent crimes, maintaining strong bail laws to keep dangerous people in jail, and providing police more support and resources.

Fully fund things that are proven to create safe communities – like good schools, jobs, and affordable housing – and **help prevent crime** by increasing treatment for mental health and drug addiction and getting illegal guns off the street.

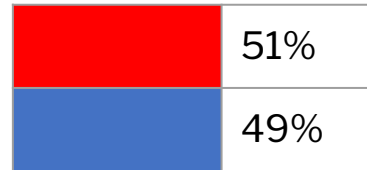
HARRIS “TOUGH ON CRIME”:

HARRIS “SERIOUS ABOUT SAFETY”:

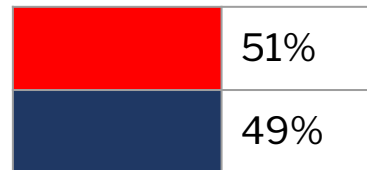

HEAD-TO-HEAD ATTACK V. “SERIOUS”



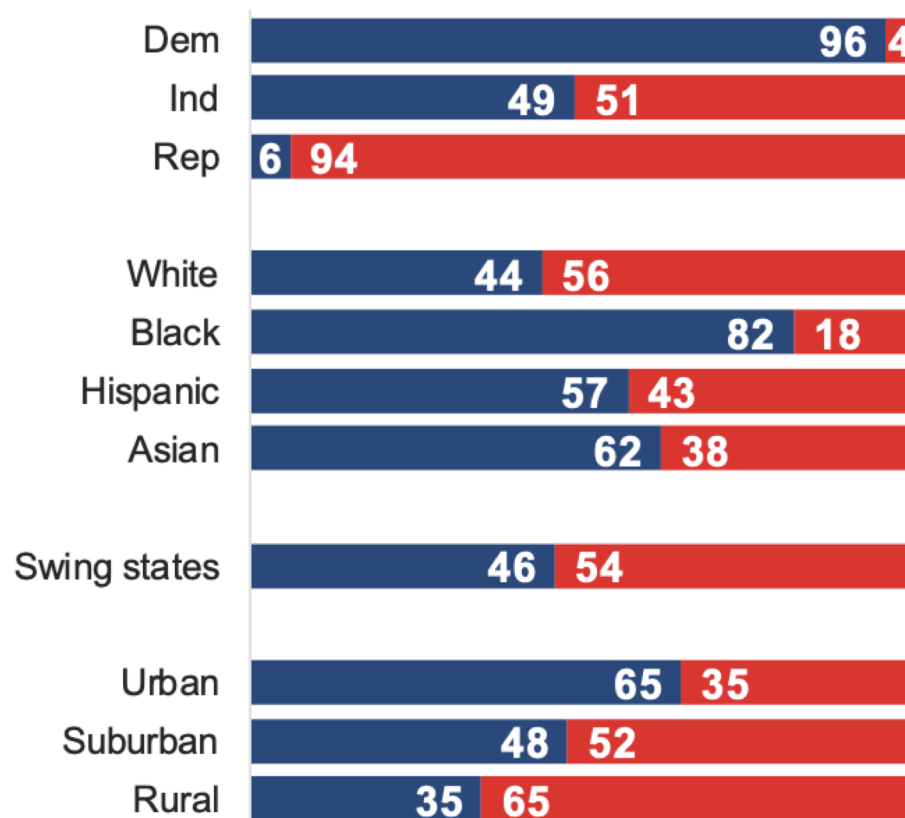

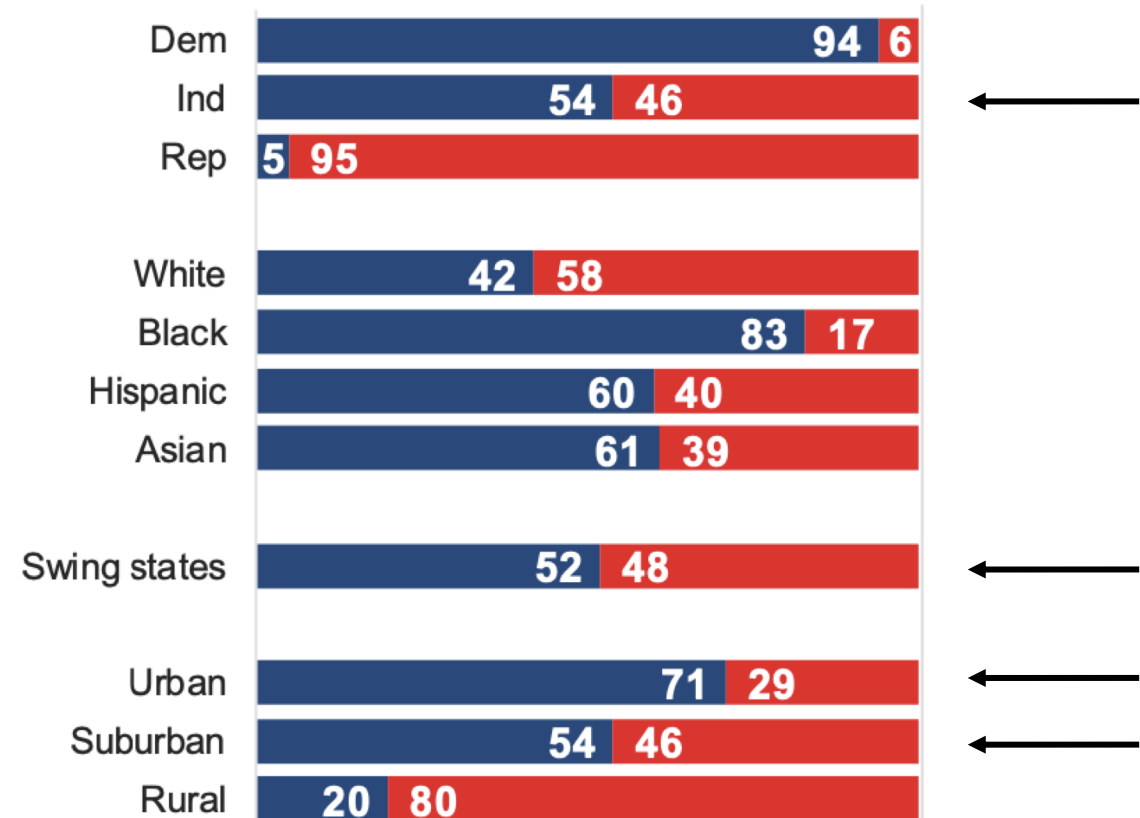
Which of the following statements about crime do you agree with more, even if neither is exactly right?

A FEW MORE NARRATIVE TIPS

1. Get off the opposition's narrative playing field and onto our own using the “values, villain, and vision” framework.

We do not win when we counter “tough” rhetoric by trying to “out-tough” the opposition. Turn the debate and get onto our own narrative turf by affirmatively messaging and inoculating against attacks using the “3 Vs.”

2. Lead with the shared values of safety, accountability, and justice.

Acknowledge the importance of safety and that we deserve an honest conversation based in solutions, not scare tactics, about what makes communities safe. Take back and redefine accountability. Everyone can walk through the safety door to get to accountability and justice.

3. Call out “tough on crime” as the villain and say “I’m about solutions, not scare tactics.”

Across the political spectrum, a majority don’t believe “tough on crime” is working. Name it as the empty scare tactic that it is. If it worked, we would be the safest country in the world.

4. Rely on empathy, not simply data, to persuade.

Countering falsely-held beliefs with empathy is more persuasive than contradicting with data. Arguing about crime statistics, for example, with legislators or the public is often not effective. Setting the record straight with journalists and media is, though.

5. Pivot to a vision by pointing to concrete solutions and things that work.

There is strong support for community-based solutions. Highlight specific programs and how they work, who they serve, and the impact they have. This is where the data is persuasive.
