SAFETY AND JUSTICE ON THE BALLOT IN 2024:

Takeaways of How Crime and Immigration Impacted the Election

In this election cycle, voters voiced a lost sense of security and stability.

If insecurity and instability is the ticking bomb, fears about crime and immigration are the wick to light the fuse.

METHODOLOGY: POST-2024 ELECTION NATIONAL POLL OF ACTUAL VOTERS ON CRIME & IMMIGRATION

Conducted October 31-November 5, 2024 via live phone and text-to-web.

1,500 registered voters who voted in the 2024 election, including voters who cast their vote on Election Day and before Election Day.

- 1,000 interviews nationally
- 200n oversample of Black voters
- 200n oversample of Hispanic voters
- 100n oversample of AAPI voters

Results reflect representative 2024 electorate.

Margin of error is +/- 3.1 percentage points.

TAKEAWAY # 1:

The GOP made this election about insecurity and instability—and Democrats were comparatively silent. "Migrant crime" and "open borders" supplanted "defund" as the go-to line of attack about crime.






TAKEAWAY # 2:

Even though crime is not a top voting issue, it lurks right under the surface as a critical one for voters. When races are won and lost on the margins, inoculating against this line of attack is critical.


Do you believe crime is a very serious or somewhat serious problem?





HOMELESSNESS AND OPEN AIR DRUG USE ARE BIGGER CONCERNS THAN "MIGRANT CRIME"


How concerned are you about each of the following types of crime impacting you?

How much do you believe the following proposals will help to reduce crime?






TAKEAWAY # 3:

Trying to "out-tough" the opposition doesn't work. Democrats need to create a values contrast to the GOP. Despite running a "tough-on-immigration-and-crime" campaign, VP Harris's message failed to break through.

TAKEAWAY # 4:





HARRIS "TOUGH ON CRIME":






Which of the following statements about crime do you agree with more, even if neither is exactly right?

A FEW MORE NARRATIVE TIPS

1. Get off the opposition's narrative playing field and onto our own using the "values, villain, and vision" framework. We do not win when we counter "tough" rhetoric by trying to "out-tough" the opposition. Turn the debate and get onto our own narrative turf by affirmatively messaging and inoculating against attacks using the "3 Vs."

2. Lead with the shared values of safety, accountability, and justice.

Acknowledge the importance of safety and that we deserve an honest conversation based in solutions, not scare tactics, about what makes communities safe. Take back and redefine accountability. Everyone can walk through the safety door to get to accountability and justice.

3. Call out "tough on crime" as the villain and say "I'm about solutions, not scare tactics."

Across the political spectrum, a majority don't believe "tough on crime" is working. Name it as the empty scare tactic that it is. If it worked, we would be the safest country in the world.

4. Rely on empathy, not simply data, to persuade.

Countering falsely-held beliefs with empathy is more persuasive than contradicting with data. Arguing about crime statistics, for example, with legislators or the public is often not effective. Setting the record straight with journalists and media is, though.

5. Pivot to a vision by pointing to concrete solutions and things that work.

There is strong support for community-based solutions. Highlight specific programs and how they work, who they serve, and the impact they have. This is where the data is persuasive.
